
In New Brunswick, 74% of victims of sexual crimes that were deemed "unfounded" were between the ages of 0 and 18.

### SEXUAL ABUSE INVESTIGATIONS BY AGE GROUP (2012-2017)

Sexual abuse investigations with young children are more likely to be unsubstantiated. It is often assumed that children cannot effectively communicate what happened.

However, the challenge is not with children's abilities to communicate, but with untrained interviewers and improper questioning techniques.






# 56% OF CHILD SEXUAL HARM REFERRALS ARE FROM FRONTLINE WORKERS

56% of the referrals to Social Development New Brunswick concerning child sexual harm are from service providers in the justice system (22%), healthcare system (18%), and school system (16%).

#### INTERVIEW QUESTIONS MATTER

The use of open-ended questions in interviews with children is the most effective type of question to reach a disclosure. Even so, open-ended questions are the least used question type by prosecutors, teachers, and police officers.
