Zoom for Healthcare Now Available for Practicing Members

In light of the current COVID-19 outbreak and the adjustments being made to online and remote delivery of social work services, the NBASW wishes to advise members that thanks to the Government of New Brunswick, Zoom for Healthcare is being made available to all Practicing Members of the NBASW. This is a measure being put in place to help NBASW Practicing Members provide services to their clients during the COVID-19 pandemic and will be available for one year from the Government of New Brunswick at no cost to these members.

Zoom is a web-based virtual care video conferencing platform and Zoom for Healthcare provides additional security measures to protect the privacy of per-

sonal health information being shared over internet channels. As mentioned in our Letter of Guidance, paid versions of Zoom, including Zoom for Healthcare, are approved as a virtual platform on which social work services may be provided.

Please note that **all Practicing Members of the NBASW are eligible** to receive Zoom for Healthcare. This includes public sector social workers (including those who work for Social Development, Horizon Health Network, Vitalité Health Network, among others), as well as in the private and non-profit sectors.

Enrolling in Zoom for Healthcare is voluntary; Registered Social Workers are not required to take this step, though it may be right for you if you:

- Need the enhancement of video to deliver client care;
- Are in self-isolation and/or available to practice remotely;
- Can provide clients currently using smart phones and computers for other only services like banking, shopping, and internet with the instructions they need to connect for care using Zoom for Healthcare; and
- Are concerned about the security of video conferencing services offered over the internet.

If you are interested in obtaining a Zoom for Healthcare license, please email ConnectedCare@gnb.ca with “Zoom” in the subject line. Please provide your name, phone number, preferred language of communication, role, employer, and whether or not you work in private practice.
